



Dr Likic qualified in Medicine with honors in Zagreb in 2001, after receiving the Dean's award for the best student of medicine in 1999. Following internship, he trained in general internal medicine at the University Hospital Zagreb and simultaneously developed an interest in the effectiveness of problem based learning applied to the teaching of clinical pharmacology. He became board certified in internal medicine in 2007 and was awarded a PhD degree in 2008. He currently works as an assistant professor at the Zagreb Medical School and as a consultant internist at the University Hospital Zagreb and continues to have an active research interest into the effectiveness of medical education both at undergraduate and postgraduate levels while also conducting research in health outcomes measures, medical informatics as well as rational use of antibiotics. Dr.Likic has had significant success in international collaboration with funding secured from the British Council to organize a multinational meeting in Zagreb in 2008 on rational use of medicines and he also received the Matovinovic fellowship award in 2009 which allowed him to spend 6 months working as a visiting scholar at the University of Michigan Medical School (Ann Arbor). His interest in informatics led him to play a pivotal role in introduction of voice over internet protocol (VOIP) based telephony systems both at Zagreb and Ann Arbor medical schools. Dr.Likic is a member of several national drug committees as well as a member of the committee for education of the European Association for Clinical Pharmacology and Therapeutics (EACPT) and a councilor to the International Union of Basic and Clinical Pharmacology (IUPHAR). He received the "Outstanding Early Educator Award" at the 16th IUPHAR World congress of basic and clinical pharmacology held in 2010 in Copenhagen (Denmark).





- 🖶 I usually start with this basic skeleton on most patients, but depending on the case I will include more or less than what I have below. By the way, I'm an EM attending in the US.

Vital signs: (To me, the absolutely most important part of the physical exam)

General: (NAD, uncomfortable, toxic, unresponsive, etc)

HEENT: Signs of trauma, Pupils, conjunctivae, oropharynx, mucous membranes, TMs

Neck: supple, LAD, JVD, thyromegaly, masses Card: rate and rhyhtm, murmurs/rubs/gallops Resp: Breath sounds, wheezes/rhonchi/rales

Abd: soft/rigid, distended, tenderness, bowel sounds, rebound/quarding, hepatosplenomegaly, masses/pulses (I also include CVA tenderness in the abdominal exam)

GU: males - scrotum, testicles, penis; females - external, vaginal, cervical exam

Ext/MSK: Clubbing, cyanosis, edema, pulses.

Derm: Rashes, bruising / trauma

Neuro: Orientation, cranial nerves, extremity strength, sensation, reflexes, gait, Finger-nose-finger, Romberg, pronator drift.

At the end of the day, develop a system (as you can see, this exam is pretty literally head to toe) that you always do, so that you never miss anything. This is especially true for trauma evaluations, as well as reading plain films.

Hope that helps, and good luck to you.



Primary care doctors may no longer be needed

As a primary care doctor, my days are busy. Seeing patient after patient, I try to provide the most patient-centric, evidence based care that I can. But if I read anything about healthcare reform, it will tell me that 80-85% of the patients I see can be seen by a nurse practitioner or a physician's assistant. So why did I train for an extra 3-4 years as a doctor, incur several hundred thousand dollars in debt, and go through years of residency training to do the same work as someone who has done a fraction of this?

With this as a background, is it any surprise that an article in the December 5th edition of the Journal of the American Medical Association reported that among internal medicine residents, those with career plans in general internal medicine were markedly less common than those with subspecialty career plans?

The term "general internal medicine" may not mean much to those not in healthcare, but these are the doctors who comprise many of this nation's hospital-based general medicine doctors and primary care doctors. Hospitalist medicine has been at the very forefront medical industry growth for the past several years; primary care, also made up of pediatricians and family physicians, has not. It is not a stretch of the imagination, then, to assume that most of the residents going into general internal medicine will not go into primary care. Study after study supports this.

There are still physicians that go into general internal medicine and choose primary care though. I am one of them. But there are days where I wonder if I would make that choice again. Here's a big reason why that has not received much attention: I don't really know if I am needed.
